Hello Beloved Children!

SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE FOR SILVER LAKE SUMMER CONFERENCES

APPLICATION DEADLINE IS APRIL 15

Marcia Carothers, 2022 FEA Scholarship Administrator, shared the following information:

"Each year the Fairfield East Association budgets scholarship funds to help youth attend events that will help them grow in their faith, learn more about their church, and simply enjoy Christian community.

<u>Click here</u> to obtain a scholarship application for financial assistance to attend ANY Silver Lake Summer Conferences (SLCC) this summer - <u>including family camp</u>.

The exact amount of the scholarship offered varies from year to year and is based on several factors including the number of applicants as well as any special circumstances relating to an individual application.

How does it work?

- The camper goes to <u>www.silverlakect.org</u> and selects their respective camp and registers.
 Campers MUST be registered in order to receive a scholarship. If the required SLCC deposit poses a problem, a camper can register without paying while awaiting scholarship help; however, they will need to contact the Silver Lake Registrar, Ruth Choate, directly at ruthc@silverlakect.org.
- The camper completes the FEA scholarship application form (*found above*), which requires a pastor signature, and emails it to feascholarship@gmail.com by April 15th.
- Receipt of the FEA scholarship application form will be acknowledged by the FEA scholarship administrator.
- FEA confirms camper registrations with SLCC.
- Camper is notified of the amount of the scholarship award in a timely manner, after April 15th.
- FEA disburses funds directly to SLCC.

Please Note...

Silver Lake also offers scholarships (in addition to any provided by FEA). The Silver Lake Scholarship Application is available through the Document Center when the camper is logged in to his or her account."

Don't wait until the last minute to apply for the FEA scholarship to Silver Lake - remember you will need Pastor Liz's signature on your application.
