#### ST. PAULY SHED NEWS

The team at St. Pauly reported that last year, 45,483 pounds of clothing were donated by CCNF to the St. Pauly shed. This is enough to clothe an estimated 8,379 people all over the world! And, that is a lot of material to keep out of a landfill.

And that's just from the CCNF shed. St. Pauly had a record year in 2021. They reported donations to all St. Pauly's sheds came to over 40 million pounds of clothing!
