Columbaria Answers to Frequently Asked Questions

What is a Columbarium?

The word "columbarium" comes from the Latin word "columbary," which is a structure for the nesting of doves – the dove being the symbol of God's spirit and peace. The related word, columbarium, refers to a burial vault for the containment of urns holding cremated human remains. The Congregational Church of New Fairfield has three columbaria - The Memorial Wall of the Martha Fairchild Memorial Garden and two free-standing, tile-faced structures that lay just outside the garden. Each of these two free-standing columbaria holds sixty (60) niches.

What is the Memorial Wall?

The Memorial Wall is a masonry stonewall columbarium comprised of 138 cylindrical niches for inurned human cremains. Each niche is approximately $10'' \times 12$," and two niches are stacked, one atop the other, within the wall and below a bluestone coping. The Memorial Wall columbarium spans the North and West borders of the Martha Fairchild Memorial Garden.

What is inurnment?

The word inurnment means the placement of cremated human remains in an urn.

What is interment?

Usually, the term *interment* refers to burial; however, with the increase in cremation, *interment* now means *placing in a final resting place*. It's the place where a person is laid to rest permanently, whether buried or inurned.

How is the property maintained?

The Columbarium is the property of the Congregational Church New Fairfield. The Columbaria will be maintained by the Columbaria Committee with funds dedicated for this purpose.

What is the cost of interment?

The current cost of interment in a columbaria at the CCNF is posted on the CCNF website and in the CCNF office. Please see the Columbaria Fee Schedule for the fees associated with interment.
