Happy Thanksgiving! It is the season of gratitude and as the church we have much to be thankful for. We dedicated our new garden space on Oct 22nd. As always we will have our youth performing in the first act, followed by a delicious dessert bar before our featured Broadway performers take the stage. There will be wonderful raffle baskets to take a chance on too!

And before you know it... Advent will begin on Sunday, Dec 3rd. Join us on Sunday, Nov 26 to decorate the Christmas tree and sanctuary so we can all begin the season together.

As the calendar rolls into November, it is time to reflect on all we have to be thankful for, and the many blessings bestowed upon us by our Creator. I would like to give thanks to all the people who volunteer to run our various teams and ensure the day-to-day functioning of our Church is as smooth as possible. Without your generous contributions of your time, our congregation would be in very dire straits. So, thank you to all who help out.

Our church is lucky to have several internal activities that support us financially, and I'd like to recognize them.

The Thrift Shop has contributed \$27,400 to our Unified Fund, which is simply amazing! They do a tremendous job sorting through donations, determining prices and then running the store on Saturday mornings 2 times a month. This is not only a great benefit to the Church financially, but also provides a needed service to the community with quality low-cost clothing options. I know they can always use additional help. Any time available to help sort or just help work the store would be welcomed, as they would like to extend their opening hours but need more help to do that.

The Summer Play was a smashing success this year, with sellouts and lots of eager young actors and actresses, singers and dancers giving a great rendition of "Cinderella." This year the play resulted in a \$8,600 profit for the Church, and we are grateful to Carl and Betsy and all the other volunteers who put this on. It's a great fundraiser, but also a wonderful presentation of our Church to the community.

November is also Stewardship time, and I would gently remind everyone to keep up on your pledges and financial donations. While our fundraising activities are successful, by far the biggest support of our operating budget comes from your pledges and donations. As you consider your pledges for next year, if you are able to increase your support it would go a long way to allowing us to continue the good work we do supporting Dorothy Day Hospitality House, ARC, Ann's Place, Regional Hospice, FISH, NFSAW, and various other community organizations. Consider giving electronically, it's the easiest way to give. It can be done directly from your bank account (BEST) or using a credit card. Credit cards do come with additional fees for the church, and there are also transactional costs so weekly giving increases those costs. The best way to contribute is monthly with an ACH transfer from your bank account.

And finally I would like to recognize the great project that occurred in our Garden area, where generous gifts from the Riccardi family, Eckhert family and gifts from the Book of Remembrance were used to put in two new retaining walls and improve, enlarge and level the bench areas.
